HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS

A NY even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba, Saskatchewan, and Alberta, excepting 8 and 28, not reserved, may be homested by any persently, the section of the section of the section of the extent of one-quarter section of 160 acres, mere or less.

Application for entry must be made in person by the applicant at a Dominion lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district in which the land is situate. Entry by proxy may, however, be made at an Agency on certain conditions by the father, mother, soon, daughter, brother or slater of an Intending homesteader.

The homesteader is required to perform the homestead duties under one of the following plans:—

(i) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year for three years.

(2) A homesteader may, if he so desires, perform the required re-sidence duties by living on farm-ing land owned solely by him, not less than eighty (9) acres in extent. In the vicinity of his homestead. Joint ownership in land will not meet this require-

ment.

(3 If the father for mother, if
the father is deceased) of a
homesteader has permanent residence on farming land owned
solely by him, not less than eighty
(80) acres in extent in the vicinity
(80) acres in extent in the vicinity
of the homestead, or upon a
homestead entered for by him
in the vicinity, such homesteader may perform his own
residence duries by living with the
father (or mother).

(4) The term "vicinity" in the two preceding paragraphs is de-fined as meaning not more than nine miles in a direct line, exclu-sive of the width of road allow-ances crossed in the measurement.

(6) A homesteader intending to perform his residence duties in accordance with the above white living with parents or on farming land owned by himself must noti-fy the Azent for the district of such intention.

Six months' notice in writing must be given to the Commis-sioner of Dominion Lands at Ot-tawa, of intention to apply for
