Only this: that we fail to realize and believe it. Only this: that when we utter these truths with our lips, our hearts are not thrilled by a realization of their intense truth. . . . Let us have recourse to this prayer:—"O Almighty God, who has built Thy Church upon the foundation of the Apostles and Prophets, Jesus Christ himself being the Head Corner-stone; grant us so to be joined together in unity of spirit by their doctrine, that we may be made an holy temple acceptable unto Thee; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen."

Dear fellow-students, it lies in our power to make such a use of the Society we are speaking about, that it shall help to bring about an answer to that prayer.

The Association has thus far counted amongst its chief supporters the Church Students of the United States but as the Constitution indicates it is meant to embrace all *American* Students; that is, those of the United States and Canada. Let us then fellow-students of King's, Bishop's, Montreal Diocesan, Trinity, Wycliffe, Huron, St. John's, and all other Canadian Church Colleges, join hands in meeting our fellow-churchmen of the United States, in missionary convention in Montreal next January.
