CONTRACTS OPEN

MEAFORD, ONT.—Clelland & Sons purpose erecting a large wheel-barrow factory during the coming year.

AMHERST, N.S.—The Town Council are looking into the merits of bitulithic pavements with a view to its adoption here.

AMHERSTBURG, ONT.—The ratepayers last week defeated a by-law to raise \$6,000 to purchase a new water-works pump.

SARNIA, ONT.—The ratepayers have asked that George street, from Front to Christina street, be paved with vitrified brick.

CARP, ONT.—The School Trustees have unanimously decided to call for plans and specifications for a new four-room school.

HULL, QUE.—Walters & Son are asking exemption from taxation on a proposed addition to their axe factory, to be 40 x 100 feet.

LONDON, ONT.—Plans of a wharf to be constructed at Collingwood, Ont., may be seen at the office of J. G. Sing, in this city.

THAMESVILLE, ONT.—W. J. Cryderman, Village Clerk, will receive tenders up to November 5th for \$12,500 4 per cent. debentures.

PORT STANLEY, ONT.—A Government engineer was here last week taking soundings in the lake for the construction of a breakwater.

GRAVENHURST, ONT.—The installation of a waterworks system is under consideration, the probable source of supply being Gull lake.

SARNIA, ONT.—Dr. Morrison has purchased property opposite the post office on which he will erect a three-story building next spring.

TEESWATER, ONT.—A by-law granting a loan of \$2,000 to Ayscott Bros., painters, to assist them in extending their business, was carried last week.
