The first amendment of the Committee to the first clause of the Bill was read, and

Mr. Grant moved, seconded by Mr. Young, that the first resolution of the Committee be laid aside, and in press sirst, line 22d. of the engrossed Bill, after the words, "passing of this Act," the following words be inserted:

"The Court of Appeals be constituted of His Excellency the Governor, Licutenant Governor or person administering the Government for the " time being, of a President or Lord President, other than the Chief Justice " of the Province, or the Chief Justice of the district of Montreal, and Six " Affociate Justices or Senators, whereof the Lord Bishop of Quebec, " and the two eldest Executive Counsellors, not Justices of any other " Court of Law, shall be three to be appointed by His Majesty from " time to time, from among the Puisné Justices of either of the Bench-· cs of Quebec, Montreal or Three-Rivers; or Sericants at Law, Bar-" rifters or Advocates of five years standing, in either of the superior " Courts of Justice of Great-Britain or Ireland; or Barristers or Ad-" vocates of feven years standing in either of the Courts of the Pro-" vince, or other His Majesty's dominions, and understanding the " French and English languages, and twenty-five years of age. And •• the Court of Appeals to conflituted, composed and cstablished, shall " have all the powers of the present Court of Appeals, and of a Court of Equity, by the rules of conscience to abate the rigour of the Law. " giving aid in proper cases to such, as in a Court of Law can have no " remedy; and this power to continue inherent in the faid Court of " supreme Junisdiction, until it shall please his Majesty to establish a Court " of Equity or Chancery in this Province. Five of the faid Senators or " Juffices of the faid Court of Appeals, the Governor, Lieutenant Gover-" nor or Person administering the Government, or the President or Vice-" Prefident, being One, may proceed to hear and adjudge causes as a " fupreme Provincial Court of Appeals, any law, usage or custom to " the contrary notwithstanding. And until it shall further please His " Majesty to establish one only Court of King's Bench, or Court of His "Palace or Castle of St. Louis, for this his whole Province of Lower Ca-" nada, with its incident branches, of Circuit Commissions of the Peace.
