The Speaker resumed the chair.

Report of the committee.

The chairman reported that the committee had gone into the confideration of the faid bill and had directed him to reporta progress therein and request leave to fit again.

And that the committee had come to the following resolutions.

Resolve.

- " Refolved, That it be recommended to the House to grant " to the counties of Queen's and Northumberland the usual affift-"ance in building Goals and Court-Houses whenever such
- " buildings shall be begun in those counties.

Refulve.

" Refolved, That it is the opinion of this committee that " commissioners be appointed by the House to prepare and re-" port at the next feifion a plan and estimate of the expence of " proper buildings for the accommodation of the General Affembly " and the Courts of Justice and that the sum of f 100 be grant-" ed to the said commissioners to purchase such boards and " plank therefor as may require feafoning before they are " wrought up."

Ordered, That the faid report be accepted.

Committee appointed.

And that the Honorable George Duncan Ludlow and John Saunders, Esquires, James Glenie, Daniel Murray and Daniel Lyman, Esquires, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to prepare a plan and estimate of the expence of proper buildings for the accommodation of the General Assembly and Courts of Justice at such place as His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor ihall point out; And that the said sum of £ 100 be paid by the Treasurer of the province to the said commissioners out of any monies hereafter to be received into the Treasury by warrant from the Lieutenant Governor or Commander in Chief for the time being with the advice and consent of His Majesty's Council, which warrant His Excellency is hereby requested to issue for that purpoie.

Meffage from the Council.

A message from the Council informing the House that they 'had concurred in passing . " A Bill for the Security and Protection " of certain Islands in the River Saint John."-And

" A Bill to continue an Act intitled An Act for laying an Im-" post."

House adjourned.
