

LOCAL BREVITIES.

T. C. Healy expects to go outside in a couple of weeks.

Postmaster Hartman announces the mail for the outside will close at five o'clock Wednesday evening.

A beautiful rainbow encircled the eastern heavens at 9:30 o'clock Thursday night, and attracted much attention.

The government has begun the erection of a new warehouse at a point on First avenue between the barracks and the court house.

Mr. Clement, legal adviser to the Yukon council, left on the steamer Canadian for Ottawa on important government business. He will return in August.

Bishop Bumpas was called upon Friday to officiate at the baptism of Lyrne Elizabeth, the infant daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Isaac Hill, residents of Dawson.

Two small moose calves were brought into Dawson on Wednesday night from up the Klondike. They are pretty little animals and it is understood will be sent to the outside for exhibition purposes.

Supt. Grant of the Good Samaritan hospital says the report that several fever patients were sent to that institution is untrue; that so far this season, there has not been a single case of the disease in his custody.

A party of well known citizens are making plans to visit the dome on June 21, popularly recognized as the longest day of the year, and catch a glimpse, if possible, of the world-famed midnight sun.

Chief Fletcher of the volunteer fire department had as his guests at dinner Sunday the winning team in the races on the Queen's birthday. On a count being made of the diners it was seen that just 18 were present.

Adjutant McGill and Ensign Bloss of the Salvation Army, were tendered a farewell reception on Tuesday night, and will leave for the outside in a few days. The gentlemen take with them the esteem and best wishes of Dawson's people.

The government have taken recognition of the two survey cases at 56 below Bonanza, as reported in the Nugget, and have placed a man in charge, besides furnishing a supply of needed foods. The news was brought in by Adjt. McGill of the Salvation Army, who was at Grand Forks on Wednesday.

The annual meeting of the Miner's Association was slated for Monday evening but no effort was made to advise the members of that fact until with the contractors so that a full report could be rendered. Little was done at the meeting excepting to discuss ways and means of lifting the load of indebtedness which by a decision of the arbitrators now amounts to between \$1200 and \$1500.

Corporal Carter, who is the deputy registrar of deaths and births, in addition to filling many other positions of responsibility, has a nearly complete record of every death which has occurred in the Klondike since the discovery of the gold fields. There is a law which requires near relatives, physicians and employers to report all deaths to the registrar and imposes a fine for neglect, but Corporal Carter has been obliged to prepare his records principally by personal endeavor. As an instance of the value of his work in this line it is cited that a woman recently came into possession of \$4,000 through the information of her husband's death, which was furnished her by Corporal Carter.


