James J. Murphy, Canadian Nat-tonal-Railways brakeman, who re-sided on the Salisbury Road, Monc ton was fatally injured shortly af-ter 2 o'clock Wednesday morning at Beaverbrook, when he was run over by a freight engine. As far as known, the deceased, who was a forward brakeman, stepped off the engine of the freight to turn switch, and in some manner slipped and fell under the engine. One leg and arm were so badly crushed that he died at the Miramichi Hos-putal, Newcastle, shortly after 6

'clock. The deceased was 29 years of age, native of Jacquet River, and had been employed on the railway for a number of years, residing in Monc ton for some time previous to his death. He was well and favorably known among his host of friends in Moncton and all along the line of railway. The deceased is survived by his widow, who belongs to Jacquet River, his mother also four brothers—John and Samuel, of Moncton, both C. N. R. employees; A. H., of St. John, and Amos in the West. Three sisters also survive— Miss Mary, of Boston, Mass., Mrs. Law, also of Boston, and Mrs. G.
