#### **Bad Luck Follows This** Vessel.

Captain Dead and Men Stray From the Schooner.

North Sydney, June 2 .- Bad luck

seems to follow the Newfoundland fishing schooner Rigel, which put into this port about ten days ago to land Capt. John Harvey for medical treatment, and who died shortly after wards at the Hamilton Hospital, following an operation for appendicitis. This morning two more of the Rigel's crew were landed here by the schr. Marconi, which picked up the men on the Banks after they had strayed from their vessel in a heavy gale on Wednesday. The men rescued by the Marconi had not been long astray when picked up and suffered no hardships. They brought the disquieting news, however, that two other dories belonging to the Rigel, each containing two men, had probably been lost. There was a chance of one of the small craft, they thought, reaching the vessel, but they had little hope of the other, which was manned by two young fellows on their first fishing trip. When the dory containing the two boys was last seen by the two men brought here by the Marconi, the gale was at its height
