#### NORRIS MAY WIN OUT.

WINNIPEG, June 29.  
The Norris group will be the largest group in the next Legislature of Manitoba, and the government probably will be a Norris one, with independent support. It was indicated from incomplete returns on elections. The only certainties in the Winnipeg venture in the proportional representation system of voting, is that F. J. Dixon, Labor, and Hon. T. H. Johnson, Attorney General, in the Norris Cabinet are elected, since they are heading the list of first choice by a wide margin. Indications were that the other eight Winnipeg members would comprise all the parties, Govt., Labor, Conservatives and Independent, so that probably no party will derive any particular advantage from the final count when it is compiled later in the week. At ten o'clock the standing, subject to revision, was, Govt., twenty, Conservatives five, Farmers seven, Labor seven, Independent three, uncertain three.

#### OF IMPORTANCE TO THE DOMINIONS.

LONDON, June 29.  
Lord Milner, presiding at a farewell luncheon to Arthur Robins, Attorney General of Victoria, Australia, stated that a proposal would be submitted next year to the Imperial Conference for a sub-division of functions in the Colonial Office by a transfer of the control of matters relating to the Dominions from the Colonial Secretary to some other authority. The matter had been under consideration but no decision had been taken upon it until it had been submitted to an Imperial Conference, dealing with constitutional relations in different parts of the Empire.
