The Storm in British Politics.

The political situation in Great Britain is the most dramatic since the convulsion over the home rule bill in 1886. Then it was a split in the Liberal party; now the Unionist party is threatened with disruption. In each case Mr. Chamberlain has been the leader of the revolt. There is a curious contrast in the position of the Conservative party 50 years ago and that in which it finds itself today. In 1836 the body of the Conservative party was protectionist and refused to follow Sir Robert Peel in his free trade programme. Peel and his followers, including Gladstone, were severed from the party, and became to all intents and purposes a branch of the Whigs. Today we find a Conservative Government disassociating itself from a Cabinet Minister because he has expressed opinions adverse to free trade.

Penny Savings Banks.

The Minister of Finance has introduced a bill to establish penny banks in Canada. In England, where penny banks originated about 50 years ago, the system is widespread, and has proved very useful as a means of encouraging provident habits. The penny bank in Germany is elaborately organized and highly popular with the masses. It is not intended in this country that it shall be a money-lending or money-making institution, but entirely money-saving. The deposits are to be placed in the Government Savings Bank, excepting five per cent, which will be held to meet the daily demands of the penny banks. The latter will pay the same rate of interest to the depositors as the Government Savings Bank pays, but the Government will allow one-half per cent more interest on penny deposits to meet the expenses of management. The penny bank will not require to have a capital, but the persons organizing it shall be required to have \$10,000 as a guarantee of good faith. It appears that a number of public-spirited gentlemen in Toronto wish to establish a bank of this description, and the Government decided to draft a general law instead of granting a special charter. These institutions will not be commercial, but rather benevolent institutions, and will be promoted chiefly by churches and fraternal organizations. In some municipalities, notably Brantford, savings banks have been organized in connection with the public schools with the object of cultivating thrift among the young. The results are reported to be very favorable. The penny banks will no doubt serve a good purpose by helping to form habits of saving, though its field will be a limited one, as the regular savings banks open accounts for very small deposits and reach the mass of the people.

Here are over \$3,000,000 worth of dutiable imports from Great Britain, upon which Mr. Borden would impose greater disabilities. This is the contribution of the Conservative party to the commercial union of the empire. Mr. Borden's action suggests the enormous difficulties in the way of Mr. Chamberlain's policy. In this country a great political party is pledged to a prohibitory tariff on all commodities which come into competition with home industry. That is the only meaning that can be read in Mr. Borden's speeches on the tariff question. The Canadian Manufacturers' Association will also offer an organized resistance to any reduction in the duties on British goods. The association is even now campaigning for an increase of duties which would bear heavily on some of the most important British exports to Canada. Mr. Chamberlain may, after a tremendous fight, get the mother country to affirm the principle of preferential trade. The colonies, also, may assent to the policy in general terms. Even the Conservative party in this country claims to be friendly to it. But it is one thing to lay down a principle and another to work it out. The real difficulty will come when a practical basis has to be laid down. The moment the mother country and the colonies begin clobbering the tariff, look out for squalls.

MORE ANTI-JEW RIOTS

Russian Peasants Destroy Property—Jews Go to Austria.

Lemberg, Galicia, June 11.—Serious anti-Jew riots are reported from Verestjko, near Brod, in Russia. An immense crowd of peasants, estimated to number 20,000, attacked the residences of all Jews in the town and did great damage. The Jews were compelled to barricade their premises. The military was called out and order restored.

Hundreds of Jews have crossed the frontier into Austria in consequence of the threatening attitude of the peasants.

Legislators On Snowshoes.

Fifty years ago, when the Minnesota territorial Legislature assembled in St. Paul, on Jan. 5, 1858, some of the members from the extreme northern counties were sadly disappointed. They had hoped to walk into the new capitol, select their seats and enjoy the pleasure incident to the first occupancy of that structure. Their homes were so far removed from the capital, and the means of communication during the winter months so poor as to practically isolate them, hence they had not been able to keep in touch with the situation, and did not know that the capitol was still unfinished, says the Minneapolis Journal. Three of them—Bolette, Kitson and Grogan, of the County of Pembina—have come the entire distance on snowshoes, and several had taken desperate chances of death by blizzards or hungry timber wolves. Several members of that legislature were afterward disastrously injured by their inability as debaters to shrewdly point out the great error of a hand in forming the great commonwealth now called the "Bread and Butter State."

52 Cars of Silver.

Dallas, Texas, June 11.—Fifty-two cars of silver ore from mines in Chihuahua, Mexico, passed north over the Rock Island Railroad today for Colorado smelters. The value of the ore is \$8,000,000. It was shipped from Chihuahua to Mexico and then came on by rail.
