A NOVEL WAY TO BEAT HOSPITAL

How Out-of-Town Patients Get Into Institution Nowadays.

It was stated to The Advertiser this afternoon that some local physicians in order to avoid paying the extra rate for out-of-town patients at Victoria Hospital have hit upon the plan of getting their patients to come to the city and stay a day at a private boarding-house, and then after entering the hospital they give the boarding-house address as their real address.

As long as no one gives the thing away, the patients are treated at the same rate as regular city patients.

According to the recently-framed rules, all people coming to the hospital, not belonging to London, or the county of Middlesex, must pay at least \$1.50 per day for their rooms. These same rooms are given to city people at \$1 and \$1.25 per day. The trust will probably have to deal with the problem of making these outsiders pay their regular rates, although how they are going to do it, if the patient chooses to give a wrong address, will be a difficult matter.

It is well known that many of the city doctors do not believe in outside rates having been raised on outside patients.

ORIGIN OF THE MAMMOTH CAVE

Interesting Lecture Last Night by Dr. Woolverton.

At a largely-attended meeting of the Anglican Young People's Union of St. Luke's Church, Broughdale, last night, Dr. S. Woolverton gave a most interesting address on "The Origin of the Mammoth Caves of Kentucky." Dr. Woolverton stated that the caves were discovered quite accidentally, just 100 years ago, and were still considered to be one of the most remarkable geological formations known. Dr. Woolverton showed a large number of stalagmites and stalactites, which he had obtained while visiting the caves several years ago, and gave a vivid description of his personal adventures while going through the different chambers of the cave, which extends for nine miles. He described the remarkable river found in the very heart of the cave, and spoke of the fish and other living things found there being entirely without eyes. In concluding, Dr. Woolverton stated that 6,000 people visited the caves last year, and he showed a number of diagrams, illustrating different features of interest.

Must Stand Trial on a Charge of Murdering His Wife.

East Toronto, Jan. 12.—Walter Blyth, of Agincourt, was sent for trial for the murder of his wife a week ago Sunday night. Blyth pleaded not guilty.
