Egg Sauce. One cup water, 2 tablespoons butter, 2 tablespoons flour, 1 teaspoon salt, 1-8 teaspoon pepper, 1 teaspoon emon juice, 2 hard boiled eggs.

Melt butter, stir in flour and cook two minutes, stirring constantly. The water may be hot when added to first mixture. Add slowly, stirring constantly. Bring to the boiling point and add salt and pepper and emon juice. Have the whites of the eggs cut in small dice and add to sauce. Make very hot and pour over fish. Rub yolks through a fine sieve over top of sauce and serve.

Spinach Sauce. Two cups spinach, 1 tablespoon cream, 1 dessertspoon lemon juice,

eggs (yolks), salt and pepper. Wash and pick over spinach. There should be two cups after cleaning. Pound this spinach with wooden potato masher and rub through a fine sieve. spinach with the cream, lemon juice, salt and pepper and yolks of eggs in a smooth saucepan. Whisk briskly over the fire till light and frothy Serve at once.

Another green sauce is made with spinach and served cold.

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
