PUSH AMALGAMATION OF DOMINION "VETS"

Sarnia Convention Approves Initial Step Taken To Consolidate ex-Service Clubs.

St. Catharines, Sept. 3.—Hearty approval was unanimously given tonight, at the convention of the Ontario command of the G. W. V. A., to the resolution passed at the Dominion convention in Vancouver with reference to the amalgamation of all the associations of ex-service men, and the Ontario executive was authorized to take such steps as they may consider will best advance the interests of veterans in Ontario, and expedite the consummation of Dominion-wide amalgamation. The resolution maintained that the question of determining a mutually acceptable policy should not precede but follow amalgamation, all questions of interior economy to be placed in the hands of the Dominion amalgamated executive.

AUTOIST MEETS DEATH IN JUMP FROM MOTOR

Robert Austin of Wingham Dies After Being Admitted To Hospital.

Wingham, Sept. 3.—Robert Austin of Wingham was almost instantly killed here shortly after noon today when he became frightened and jumped from a car in which he was riding. P. McGue, the owner of the car, was driving along the Teeswater road, about a mile out of Wingham when the axle broke, and the car swerved into the ditch. Austin, apparently fearing that the car was going to turn over, jumped and landed on his head. He was rushed to the Wingham General Hospital, but died from hemorrhage shortly after being admitted. WILL EXAMINE "VETS" IN PENITENTIARIES

Authorities To Ascertain Mental Status of All Returned Men Serving Time.

Canadian Press Despatch.
Ottawa, Sept. 3.—Following a request by C. G. MacNeil, secretary Dominion command, G.W.V.A., General W. S. Hughes, superintendent of Canadian penitentiaries, has directed the surgeon at each institution to conduct an examination of returned soldier inmates, in order to ascertain their mental condition. The move is in line with action in the U. S., where, in Wisconsin, above 50 per cent of the veterans in the penal institutions were mentally abnormal, and where 20 per cent of these men were suffering from some mental disability directly traceable to military service. The result of the survey of ex-soldier inmates of Canadian prisons is being awaited by the G. W. V. A. with intense interest, and in cases where doubt exists, alienists will be called in to determine the exact status.

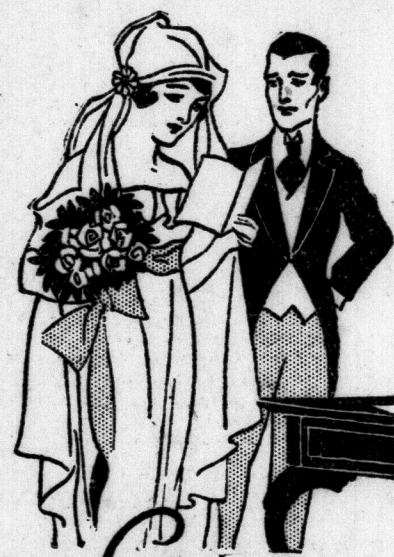
