Salisbury Demands Immediate Explanation From Dom. Gov. Why British Troops Were Sent to Beira - A Revolt in a Portuguese Dependency South of the Gambia - The Garrison Massacred.

London, April 21. - The Press Association announces that Lord Salisbury has demanded from the British Minister at Lisbon a demand from the Portuguese Government an immediate explanation of the seizure of British vessels at Beira, and that the British Government is not satisfied and Salisbury will insist upon reparation.

London, April 21. - The natives of Portuguese Guinea, west coast of Africa, have revolted and have taken complete possession of the garrison on the island of Bissau which has been overpowered and all the Portuguese officers and soldiers massacred.

A MUTINY IN THE GUARDIANS.

The Grenadiers Refuse to Obey Their Officers When Ordered Out on Parade to Suppress a Riot in Beira. London, April 21. - There is renewed and great excitement in military circles caused by a mutiny demonstration in the 3rd Battalion Grenadier Guards, the first of its kind since the outbreak of the Boer war.

THE OUTBREAK PREVENTED.

The outbreak appears to have been a pre-meditated affair. It was at first supposed the trouble was confined to the Guards quartered at Chelsea Barracks. It is now announced that there was a plot to overthrow the Grenadier Guards quartered at St. George's Barracks.

A Full Tax Riot.

FALEMO, April 21. - Falemo was a serious riot at Carda yesterday growing out of the opposition to the poll tax. Two thousand persons protested against the tax and, including the prison, released a comrade confined there. They marched to the municipal offices, where they destroyed the records. Many rioters were arrested. Troops have been dispatched to the scene.
