CANADIAN SECURITIES ARE QUIET AND UNSETTLED,

iterling Exchange Firmer at New York Wheat Active and Lower in the Wes -Provisions Rather Heavy-Local Grain Market Very Flat-Latest Gossip From Friday Evening, July 26.

Sterling exchange is 1-4 higher in New Consols firmer, closing at 107 for money and at 107 1-16 for account. Canadian Pacific is lower, closing in London to-day at 50 3-4; St. Paul closed at 71 1-4, Erie at 10 1-4, Reading at 9 and N.Y.C. at 104. In London the market for American securities opened irregular, and then became active and higher. It is thought likely that there will be no more gold shipments for the present. A decrease of a million bushels in wheat visible is expected on Monday.



Money Markets The local money market is unchanged at 4.1-2 per cent, for call loans. At New York rates are unchanged at 1 to 11-2 per cent, and at London 1-4 per cent. The Bank of Eugland discount rate is unchanged at 2, and the open market rate 5-8 per cent.
