The management of grant requests initiated outside the Institute was consolidated under the Secretary/Treasurer and is carried out by two grants administrators and a part-time secretary.

In June a Research Grants Advisory Committee was created, composed of three outside advisers, the Director of Research and the Secretary/Treasurer, to review all research grant applications and make recommendations. At its March 1987 meeting the Board approved the formation of a similar committee for Public Programmes grants.

A total of 269 requests for grants was received amounting to \$3,926,465. 108 were approved totalling \$782,305. By type, there were 66 requests in Research and 203 in Public Programmes of which 28 were approved in the former and 80 in the latter category. Additional statistical detail about the Institute's granting activity may be found in the diagrams below. When reviewing this information it should be remembered that the facts portrayed apply only to what are termed independent "responsive" grants: partnerships, cooperative projects, and contracts are discussed elsewhere in this report. Lists of grants made are at Annexes G and H.

The first CIIPS Awards Programme was developed and launched during the year. It is aimed at encouraging Canadians from all disciplines to enter the field of international peace and security studies. The programme is intended in part to develop Canadian expertise as well as contacts between Canadians and members of the international community working in this field. \$125,000 per annum was allocated, to be divided into two awards valued at up to \$25,000 each and five awards of up to \$14,000 annually. At year end some 34 applications for these awards were in the process of being screened by the Association of Universities and Colleges of Canada.

In June the Board approved a modest programme of bursaries for activities that fall within the mandate but do not otherwise qualify under other programmes. Recipients are listed at Annex I.
