This declaration was followed by a meeting of the foreign inisters of the United States, the United Kingdom and the U.S.S.R. In Moscow in December 1945, at which time the Washington proposals are endorsed. These three governments then invited Canada, China and France to join with them in sponsoring the proposal at the leneral Assembly. The United Nations Atomic Energy Commission was stablished by unanimous resolution at the first meeting of the General assembly on 24 January 1946, in London.

In this resolution the terms of reference of the Commission tere laid down. The Commission was instructed to enquire into all phases of the problem of atomic energy and to make recommendations in particular in regard to the following points:

- (1) The elimination from national armaments of atomic energy and all other weapons of mass destruction.
- (2) Exchange of basic scientific information.
- (3) Control to the extent necessary to ensure the use of atomic energy for peaceful purposes; and
- (4) Provide effective safeguards by way of inspection and other means to protect complying states against the hazards of violations and evasions.

Before discussing what has been accomplished by this Commission in its three years of work, I would like to mention the steps which here taken at the same time looking to the control and regulation of the more orthodox weapons of war or, as they came to be called, conventional armaments."

## FIRST GENERAL ASSEMBLY RESOLUTION ON REGULATION AND REDUCTION OF HAMENTS, DECEMBER 14, 1946.

Together with the control of atomic energy the General Assembly as faced with the problem of the control of other armaments. This itter became one of the main issues at the Second Part of the First ession of the General Assembly held in New York in October of 1946. It discussions were initiated when the Soviet Union in the tradition established by the Czars introduced a resolution couched in general reasolution for a general reduction in all categories of armaments. It is issue was further complicated by the introduction by the U.S.S.R. a resolution dealing with the presence in foreign countries (other an ex-enemy territories) of armed forces of member states of the ited Nations. The debate on this matter in the Political Committee the General Assembly immediately preceded the debate on disarmament all later the two issues became confused, and were only separated with efficulty. Finally two resolutions were passed by the General sembly on 14 December 1946, one on the general regulation and function of armaments, and the other calling for the Security Council determine the information which the member nations should furnish to their armad forces in order to implement the resolution on the security of the United Nations to take such an important first step wards general disarmament. The adoption of the resolution on the lared regulation and reduction of armaments by unanimous vote prefere did much to restore confidence in the United Nations as instrument of world peace and led to a feeling of optimism which there events have shown to be somewhat premature.
