If the amendment had been confined to the latter part, asking the government to submit to the house its program of dealing with this great question, there would be no doubt as to what we of the labour group and the other members in this corner of the house would do. But when we find coupled with this resolution all these "whereases" as to what was said by the Prime Minister in about fifteen different parts of the dominion, it is time this kind of politics was cut out entirely from our proceedings and we got down to the really fundamental questions before us. Therefore, as a protest against this form of resolution, we have decided to abstain from voting on this question.
