been a very simple matter if the government wanted to disclose this correspondence, to use those words which the government uses so often in respect of correspondence between the federal authority and the various provinces, that they will table the documents subject to receiving approval from the government in question.

This is what happens when the federal government deals with the Columbia river project in British Columbia or with any other province. Subject to the approval of that government, the federal government tables the documents. I am sure this could have been done with respect to other nations.

Another point is that we requested information as to whether or not any negotiations were taking place. All we have received has been silence in that regard and the inability of the minister to make any commitment. This is understandable and appreciated. However, the Secretary of State for External Affairs (Mr. Green) has shown an unwillingness even to indicate that negotiations are taking place. In the light of this, I think we have no other recourse but to vote on this particular resolution.
