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he says: "Oh no, you do not change things; that means recognizing we may have made a mistake. I cannot do that, there might be some political cost. Why should I admit a mistake and get egg on my face just because there happens to be a few hundred companies going out of business in western Canada?"

**Mr. Waddell:** Why don't you say something positive so they will think that western Canadian politicians might have something to say occasionally? Then maybe they would listen.

Mr. Andre: The NDP member wants me to say something positive.

Mr. Waddell: Right.

**Mr. Andre:** We know that as the little red rump of the Liberal Party, this hurts him as much as it hurts them. The only positive thing I can say about this is to plead with you to defeat this legislation and serve Canada well.

## The Acting Speaker (Mr. Ethier): Order, please.

**Mr. Smith:** I rise on a point of order, Mr. Speaker. It would appear that due to a typographical error in the instructions which the Table has received, Bill C-108 was called rather than Bill C-103. I would seek the unanimous consent of the House that the debate which has occurred so far on this bill be deemed to have applied to Bill C-103 rather than Bill C-108.

**The Acting Speaker (Mr. Ethier):** Is it agreed that Bill C-103 will be deemed to have been introduced, rather than Bill C-108?

Some hon. Members: Agreed.

The Acting Speaker (Mr. Ethier): Agreed and so ordered. It being six o'clock, I do now leave the chair until two o'clock p.m. tomorrow.
