J.C. Tory - to whom, perhaps you would be good enough to give me a letter of introduction, or some other prominent person you may know in either the city of Halifax or Amherst ?

If you concur in this action, Mr Scammell says that the expense incurred may be charged against the 'reserve' held by his Department from the current year's Grant, which he considers warrantable.
