Dear Dr. Nicholson:-

At the next meeting of Corporation I wish to have brought up consideration of the present B.H.S. course at Macdonald College. You will remember our conversation the other day.

There is no doubt that the course as at present constituted has outlived its usefulness and it should be changed and improved as soon as possible. It stands to reason that if we grant a Bachelor's Degree we should, in principle, be willing to give a Master's Degree in the same field. I can well understand that the Graduate Faculty would refuse to permit one of our graduates in our Household Science course going on to take Graduate work because the subjects are not continuous.

This is a matter to which we must give earnest consideration.
