research," says he, in the sixth report on the northwest tribes of Canada, B. A. A. S., "is to be found in North America which equals this Province in interest and value. Indeed it may be questioned whether anywhere on the globe there can be found within so limited a compass so great a variety of languages, of physical types, of psychical characteristics, of social systems, of mythologies, and, indeed, of all the subjects of study embraced under the general head of anthropology."
