# **MUST OBEY RULES**

Orders Issued on Requirements of War Risk Insurance Plans.

OTTAWA, Oct. 9.—Further advices received by the government from the imperial authorities show the importance of shippers bearing in mind that the provisions of the war risks insurance scheme that ships must conform to the orders of the admiralty as to route, ports of call, stoppages,

MANY WOMEN ADDRESSED ON-TARIO SUFFRAGE ASSN. First Meeting of Season Was Held Last Night.


