caployed for every mile coutracted for, the superiutendent will bo at liberty to make up the number, by employing men at the expense of the coutractor, should he seo fit.
14. No work to be sub-let without the consent of the superintendent.
15. The work to be completed before the 1st Novomber, 1861 ; but should more than une half of it remain to be done on the 10 th October, 1861, the superintendent may then employ men at the contractor's expense to completo it.
16. Persons ubandoning their work will forfeit the work performed.
17. One-third of the price will be paid when one-half of the work is done, and the remainder when it is completed and necepted; but the contractor's securitics are to receivo the balanec due, or any part of it that the superintendent may consider them eutitled to, fhould they be obliged to complete the work, or any part of it.
18. The contractor is to give the best accomnotation in his power to the superintendent, or person appointed to oversee the work; such accommodation to be paid for at a reasonable rate.

The Commissioner of Crown Lands will not consider it necessary to acoept the lowest tender, nor to let the full extent of mork advertised, should he find the rater proposed too high.
