Toronto Will See International Match — Officers Elected for Coming Year.

At the adjourned annual meeting of the Canadian Cricket Association, D. W. Saunders, president, occupied the chair, and representatives from the clubs of Toronto and district were present. A letter was read from Mr. Young of Philadelphia, offering the association a match in September next with the Marylebone Cricket Club. Messrs. Saunders, Vickers and Hall were appointed a committee to make arrangements for the same.

W. C. Barber of Montreal wrote after consultation with the cricketers of his district with whom he had discussed the association's circular, a letter to the effect that the C. C. A. should consist of a small committee representing associations. He made a request that the association be not practical at the present time. It was also decided that the international match must be played in Toronto.

It was decided that, in view of the fact that Philadelphia is sending an eleven to Ottawa on Aug. 1, 2 and 3, the dates for the international be Aug. 5, 6 and 7.

Officers for 1907 were elected as follows: Hon. President, His Excellency the Governor-General; president, D. W. Saunders; vice-presidents, J. W. Woods (Toronto), Dr. Beemer (Montreal), Dr. G. B. H. Garret, Dr. Beemer, L. Rawlinson, W. C. Barber, A. O'Keefe and J. E. Hall. In case of resignation of any one of the above R. B. Perrie of Hamilton will be selected to fill the vacancy.

The Montreal Jockey Club's inaugural meeting at Blue Bonnets track, opening June 4 and closing June 12, embraced 11 racing days, during which 99 races, ten of them steepchases, were decided, the total distribution in stakes and purses being \$24,175.
