SEES CHANGE TO TRADE CANADA AND NEW ZEALAND
Government Commissioner Thinks Country Can Use Canned Meat From Far Away Colony.

For the last six years J. Graham Gow, acting as trade representative of the New Zealand Government, has been investigating the chief markets of the world for the purpose of noting their possibilities and developing business relations. For some months he has been in Canada in continuation of his tour, and during that time he has visited the principal business centres of the Dominion.

What, Mr. Gow, did you think New Zealand could send Canada? "Well, I have told my government that there is a good market here for canned goods, if our canners can meet local requirements. New Zealand mutton is exceptionally good, and should be readily sale here. We would need to have a direct line of steamship service between New Zealand and Vancouver. Sheep are difficult to handle, and on account of the long and severe winter, and I have been informed that New Zealand mutton would be taken in large quantities."

Fast Passenger Service.
What do you think about a quick direct passenger service? "In my opinion it would prove an unqualified success. You in Canada are a traveling public, and I believe in all the chief centres in Europe and land, which is in practice in contact with every variety of scenery in the smallest of compass."

What do you think Canada can send New Zealand? "I found a great deal of New Zealand wool used here, practically all from London. I see openings for flax and kauri gum. For development of commercial relations we must have a service to eastern ports. Talking of his visit to Ottawa, Mr. Gow remarked that he had several interviews with Sir Wilfrid Laurier, and found him to be an ardent imperialist and anxious to get Canada into closer relationship with New Zealand. In Montreal he saw no prospects for trade, and he considered Toronto to stand in the first place in trade possibilities. He advocated a subsidized line of steamers from Eastern Canada, stating that he would offer to guarantee 6000 tons of cargo had been made.

What We Can Sell 'Em.
There is an opening in New Zealand for the sale of all kinds of goods and shoes, paper—we have no pulpwood. New Zealand is a cash market, and the people are all well off. Canadian merchants tell me that they would like to do business with us. We take much lumber from Vancouver. "How about your state railways?" "They are very successful, and the service is satisfactory. Our department gives a ticket good for six weeks over all the New Zealand roads in the ten islands for \$35, and it will be extended for the first at any station in payment of another \$750. Under state ownership we are doing well. For example when our farmers send down their grain and products to the seaports they can get their lime or any other fertilizer carried back free of charge. The New Zealand service compares very favorably with the Canadian service, and has recently been improved. As to rates first-class is three cents a mile, and the par-transport rate is two cents."

How about your position towards Asiatic Immigration? "New Zealand, like Australia, is determined to be a white man's country. We do not like Asiatics, especially the Japanese, who are everywhere. Among the younger Japanese the talk is always about taking Hongkong and the Philippines, and ultimately work their way to Australia and New Zealand. You can trust a Chinaman in trade, but not a Jap."
