Ottawa, Oct. 19.-(Special.)-A communication was received at the Department of Trade and Commerce to-day from Mr. Thomas Moffatt, a leading produce merchant of Cape Town. South Africa. Mr. Moffatt is an ardent Britisher. He desires to see inter-Imperial trade extended. He thinks Canada is neglecting her opportunities in that she does not endeavor to secure a footing for her products in South African markets. Three lines of steamers ply monthly between New York and the Cape; there are none from the Dominion. Mr. Moffatt urges the Government to take steps to establish a direct steamship line between Canada and South Africa. He believes it would pay, as the Cape folks would prefer to send their products to and buy from sister colonies.
