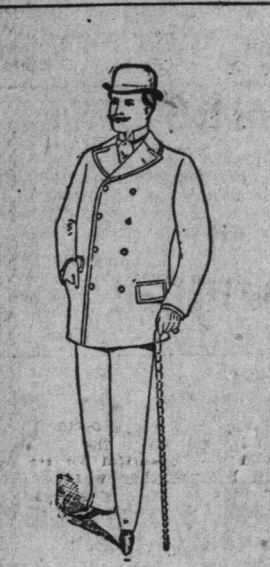

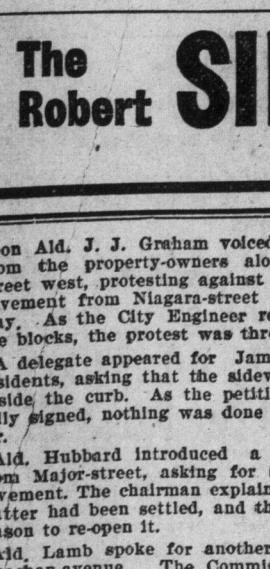

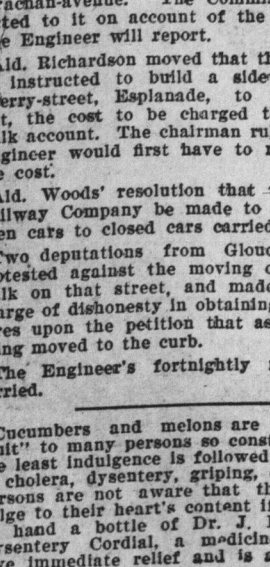

East Buffalo Cattle Market.
East Buffalo, Sept. 23.—Cattle.—The offer-
ings were two loads and with a fair de-
mand. The market was steady. Calves
were in fair supply, good demand, and
sold about the same as yesterday. Choice
to extra were quotable \$8 to \$8.25; good
to choice, \$7.50 to \$8.

Sheep and Lambs.—There were 250 loads
of fresh stock, including 18 loads of Cana-
dian lambs. The demand for good sheep
and lambs was fair and prices pretty well
sustained, considering volume of offerings.
Common grades were slow. There was a
choice of \$5.50 to \$5.75; good to
choice, \$5 to \$5.50; common to fair, \$4.50
to \$5. Sheep, choice to extra, \$4.50 to
\$4.75; do, mixed, \$4.25 to \$4.50; good to
choice, \$4 to \$4.25; common to fair, \$3 to
\$4.50.

Hogs.—Although the offerings were quite
liberal, 40 loads, the demand was active
throughout the session, and a few cars of
late arrivals sold at firm prices. The bulk
of prices was lower, however, on Sept. 23.
Corn Yorkers sold \$4.15; medium, \$4.12 1/2;
pigs, \$3.80 to \$3.90; roughs, \$3.50 to \$3.60;
stags, \$2.75 to \$3.25; grassers, \$4 to \$4.10.
