

GOLD WATCH FOR KHAMA. Prince of Wales Sends a Gift to Great African Chief.

London, March 31 .- The Prince and Princess of Wales have sent a gold watch and chain to Khama, the Bechuana chief, as a memento of their chuana chief, as a memento of their meeting with him at Cape Town last year, and in recognition of his loyalty. Khama, who is head of the Bamangwato tribe, is the most interesting native personality in South Africa. Accompanied by the chiefs, Bathoen and Sabele, he made a "pligrimage of protest" thru England when the marking out of the boundaries of Rhodesia was in progress, and succeeded in retaining his independence, ceding only a strip of territory for the Bechuanaland section of the Cape to Cairo Railway.

Khama, who dresses as a European, is an intelligent and refined man. When quite a lad, he was trained in the truths of Christianity by Robert Moffat, the celebrated missionary. This early teaching has had far-reaching results for good among his people. The sale of intoxicating liquor is prohibited in his territory.

All thru the war, Khama and his men have been of great service to the British forces, and the Bechuanas, generally, mainly thru his influence, have asserted their loyalty to Great Britain in an unmistakable manner.

Khama had always a deep feeling of respect and reverence towards Queen Victoria. During his visit to England, her late Majesty presented him with an Indian shawl.

BUTLER DENOUNCES CROMWELL. Irish General Calls Protector Thoro-Paced Scoundrel.

London, March 31 .- The lecture of Cromwell, by General Sir William Butler, before the Irish Literary Society last week, excited much comment. The speaker denied that the Lord Protector had a single good trait, and accused him of brutality, duplicity, bloodthirstiness, hypocrisy and a general lack of ability, in a manner which gave great satisfaction to the emotional, poetical and religious Irishmen in his audience. It was a good lecture, too, in a literary sense, and was well delivered.

General Butler is an Irish Liberal, and The Spectator, in condemning his estimate of Cromwell, laments that the alliance of the Irish with the Liberals has led to a deplorable trampling on formerly cherished Liberal beliefs.

The main cave is at the d of Clark's Valley, 14 miles southeast Flagstaff. Until last August the main e had been penetrated to a depth of only feet. E. R. Dalton of New York then dored the cave past the point where the rowness of the opening had stopped othexplorers, and found that the passage s gradually widened out into a series of mbers, all of solid ice. Ince then other exploring parties have covered that the caves are mines of maustible ice, which extends far down the bowels of the earth. The temperate in the cave drops 60 degrees during a first 20 minutes of descent.
