GREEKS ENTER ALBANIANS

TERRIFIED ALBANIANS FEARING MASSACRE BY THE GREEKS ARE FLEEING FROM THEIR HOMES

Repeated Protests Have Been Made to Peace Conference Against Greek Advances Into Territory Awarded To Alkania-122,000 Albani ans Leaving Koritza District. | Government Fixes Day For

Paris, Sept. 15.—Albanian refugees arriving in Paris from Koritza and the surrounding district bring reports of the terror inspired by the advance of Creek troops into that territory, which formerly was controlled by the French, who entered the district in 1916, and gave pledge that it would be considered a part of Albania.

Repeated protests have been made to the peace conference against Greek advances into territory awarded to Albania by the London conference, but no replies have been forthcoming, and lack of information concerning the plans of the Entente, ft is asserted, is causing much uneasiness to the Albanians, who are in fear of some secret agreement as regards Albania.

BURNING ITSELF OUT

Fifty Persons Were Injured While Property Damage Amounts to Millions.

New York, Sept. 15 .- The spectacular oil fire which since Saturday afternoon has raged at the plant of the Sone & Fleming Company in Long Island City, with injury to more than 50 persons and property damaged running into the millions, was gradually burning itseif

Although officials of the fire departmen said that the blaze was well under control, it still was burning briskly and promised to continue for two or three days, until the thousands of gallons of oil in the path of the flames have been consumed.

Herbert L. Pratt of the Standard Oil Company, of which the Sone & Fleming plant is a subsidiary, said after a survey of the ruins that the property damage would be more than \$2,000,000. About \$500,000 of this sum is said to be represented by oil consumed in the fire. A handbill brought by one of the Germans also promises that the bank of Argentine nation would lend money on easy terms and for long per-iods so that immigrants might pay for machinery and live stock.
