HAMILTON, May 20.—(Special)—The coroner's jury that investigated the death of Charles Smith reported: "We believe that the deceased came to his death by the discharge of a gun in his own hands." Dr. Gromaway said the shot entered the mouth and came out at the side of the face. None of his family or friends knew why he should end his life. The widow could not attend on account of illness.
