A Gazette was published in Venice, 1836; in France in April, 1631. The "Public Intelligencer," established in 1663, was the first English newspaper, and the "Boston News-Letter," published 24th April, 1704, was the first American. The first newspaper proper on the American continent was the

The total number of newspapers and periodicals now published is given in Hubbard's "Newspaper Dioectory" as 34,274, with a circulation of about 116,000,000 copies, the annual aggregate circulation reaching, in round num bers, 10,600,000,000 copies. Europe leads with 19,557, and North America follows with 12,400, the two together making over nine-tenths of all the publications in existence. Asia has 775; South America, 690; Australasia, 661; and Africa, 132. 16,500 are printed in English, 7,800 in Gorman, 3,850 in French, and over 1,600 in Spanish. There are 4,520 daily papers, 18,274 tri-weeklies and weeklies, and 8,508 issued less frequently. While the annual aggregate circulation of publications in the United States is 2,600,000, 000, that of Great Britain and Ireland is 2,260,000,000.
