CURRIE'S BOILER AND STILL ESTABLISHMENT.

NEIL CURRIE established his boiler works now located on the Esplanade, in 1851. Forty hands and an engine of twelve-horse power are kept constantly employed. The establishment is complete in all its departments, the machinery used being of the very best kind, and fitted up with all the latest labor-saving improvements. He manufactures boilers for marine and stationary engines, stills, iron agitators, tanks, &c. Some of the largest oil establishments in Canada have been supplied by him.

BREWERIES.

DON BREWERY was established in 1834, by Mr. Thos. Davies, and is now carried on by Davies and Bro. This brewery is on the River Don near Queen street. A steam engine of twelve horse power is used, and nine hands employed. The premises were greatly enlarged four years ago, and now have a manufacturing capacity of 3,500 gallons a day. The quality of ales and porter is unsurpassed. The water used is obtained from the City Water Works.

EAST TORONTO BREWERY.—This brewery was established on Parliament street near King, in 1847, by Mr. William Copland. The buildings are brick, 120 feet by 130, with a capacity of manufacturing 20,000 bushels of malt during the season.

QUEEN STREET ALE AND PORTER BREWERY, J. Cornell, The premises are well adapted for brewing purposes and a very excellent article of ale and porter is turned out. Capacity between 4,000 and 5,000 gallons per week. The stock cellar is first class.

VICTORIA BREWERY.—This extensive brewery is situated on Gould street, corner of Victoria, and was established in 1849. It is now owned and carried on by Messrs. O'Keefe & Co. It has a capacity of 7,000 gallons a week. The malt floors in the new building have been put up with much care

SEVERN'S BREWERY, YORKVILLE.—Established 40 years. This large establishment was erected at a cost of \$40,000. The machinery and appurtenances are of the best quality. Capacity about 50,000 gallons per annum.

WALZ'S BREWERY, established in 1858, by John G. Walz. Premises are on Duchess street near Sherbourne. Manufactures exclusively lager beer of first-class quality. A notable feature of this establishment is the patent cellar, of which there are only three others on the continent. It is well worthy of general adoption.
