THE CONTINGENT FUND.

The objects of the fund are,—1. To make up the deficiencies of poor circuits in the Wesleyan Connexion : a circuit pays the minister's allowance so far as it can, and this fund is designed to pay the remainder. 2. To assist the travelling preachers in the time of personal or family affliction, when they need such help. 3. To pay the various expenses which are of a connexional character.

THE SUPERANNUATED FUND.

This fund is for the support of such aged and infirm Itinerant Methodist Preachers as can no longer perform the work of efficient ministers; and also for the support of the widows and children of deceased preachers.

The fund is supported by,—1. The yearly subscriptions of the travelling preachers, each paying one pound. 2. The contributions of the people on the circuits, to whom application is to be made by the preachers yearly, in the month of December or January. 3. The interest coming from an invested part of the Centenary Fund. The receipts of last year were—
