N. S. DEFENCE OF McDONALD'S APPOINTMENT

Amherst, N. S., March 2—(Canadian Press)—The attack on the appointment of Senator McDonald by the St. John Standard is discussed by the Amherst News.

As J. A. McDonald enters the Senate he not only takes thither his own keen intellect but he carries with him a baggage of other appointments ever had when entering the Red Chamber. He goes to the upper house the choice of Canadian labor. Is the St. John Standard so steeped in the dregs of partisanship that it cannot concede to Canada's great mass of workmen the privilege of approving of one member out of the ninety-six that go to make up the Canadian Senate? Labor as a body has endorsed Mr. McDonald. He has toiled from the east to the west standing solidly behind him. Should not such a representative be an asset in Canada's Senate?

The News deals with the disputed question of eligibility, saying:

"J. A. McDonald is a New Brunswick county boy, being born and educated at Shediac, N. B. He was station agent at Shediac at the time he decided to go into the music business. He started business in Moncton, N. B., and even when he started a store in Halifax he maintained stores in St. John, N. B., Moncton and Shediac. A few years ago, having established a piano factory in Amherst, which is practically on the border line of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick, he bought a farm in Shediac, N. B., built a home there and he and his family lived there. Just recently he purchased a house in Amherst so that during the winter season, when he is not to be in closer touch with the factory there, he could have his family with him."

"He has always had business interests in New Brunswick and has for some time been vice-president of Atlantic Underwear Co., one of Moncton's most important industries. Besides this he has, as before mentioned, his 'home' residence at Shediac, N. B."
