MR. BILLING, M. P., IS TO RESIGN

Attitude of Lloyd George is Given as Reason—Forms a Party of His Own.

London, May 22.—(Canadian Associated Press)—Pemberton Billing, independent member of parliament for East Hertfordshire, in resigning his seat in the House of Commons, says, in a letter to the Speaker, that he is doing so because Premier Lloyd George has rendered the commons "unwholesome and unfair at the instigation of a cannibal of international financiers and has used his majority to sterilize the independent criticism of his bureaucratic and dishonest administration."

Mr. Billing is a party of his own in the House of Commons.

CHURCHES AID WAR ON FOREST FIRES

At the request of the minister of lands and mines, Hon. C. W. Robinson, all the clergy in the province yesterday called the attention of their congregations to the necessity for guarding against forest fires. Rev. Dr. J. A. Morrison in his sermon in the First Presbyterian church last night, spoke of the use and value of trees to the people. He explained how trees purify the air, how they supply food to the people and provide lumber from which so many essential things are made and impressed upon his hearers the importance of safeguarding the trees.
