All this metal was obtained at
the Signal Detachment, West Point
Barracks, Esquimaux, B.C. Since
this was Army metal, I did not
think there was any harm in taking
it, although I know it was contrary
to Army Regulations.
I make this statement voluntarily
knowing it to be true to the best of
my knowledge and belief.

On May 5, 1949 I transported a
quantity of metal, by Army Truck, to
Hank's Plumbing & Heating, 1323
Government St., Victoria, B.C. I received
\$37.50 for this metal, which consisted
melted down lead.

On two occasions I transported, by
Army Truck, quantities of metal which
consisted of melted down lead, to
Fit and Best Plumbing and Heating,
601 Esquimaux Rd, Esquimaux, B.C. I
do not remember the amount of
money received for the metal on these
two occasions.
