that the Provincial Secretary was now ready to assist the St. John & Eastern railway. If he was elected he promised assistance as far as lay in his power to aid John improvements and took credit to himself for his labors in the county.

MR. W. B. CARVILLE. The St. John opposition would be unable to agree with that in other counties. Dr. Stockton had said that Mr. Blair did not intend giving a subsidy for the dry dock, and had read the attorney general's answer to an elector at Stanley.

Dr. Stockton had referred to the remarks of the other Dr. Stockton or Dr. Alward.

Referring to the dry dock he showed many reasons why the government would extend their most hearty aid to such improvements. He challenged Mr. Stockton to prove the figures he had stated to be expanded by the Attorney General.

He was not surprised at Mr. Blair's answer to the Stanley elector, for Mr. Blair could not act before consulting his associates.

Dr. Stockton had referred to the remarks of the other Dr. Stockton or Dr. Alward.

He had said that the doctor had allowed his personal prejudice to override his better judgment. Of religion he had never publicly spoken, knowing his associates only as men, and as men in whom he could place implicit trust (Applause). He asked Dr. Stockton to state whether, if he were elected, he would attempt to displace Mr. Ritchie and replace Mr. Peters.

MR. H. A. MCKENNON. He attacked the local government for having "withheld from the young men the privilege of voting" until, as he said, they were forced to grant it. He took up the abolition of the legislative council and accused Mr. Blair of "playing fast and loose" with the general opinion of the people. He said the opposition candidates would, if elected, be in a position to demand a sum for the dry dock, but the government candidates could not ask for it. He spoke of the dock matter as a whip by which the government was sustained by the city and county of St. John.

MR. L. LAWRENCE STUBBS. He was giving a rough reception. He was suffering from a terrible cold, but he made a telling speech. Of the issue raised in this constituency, he asked, "What is it? Suppose Mr. Peters had been displaced, what reason was there for opposition to the government in itself? But Mr. Peters had not been displaced, and as the government had never held the office of police magistrate for the united city (Applause).

Another thing, Mr. Peters never was judge of the city court, nor was he ever magistrate of the city of St. John as at present exists (Mr. Stockton—Hear, hear). Mr. Peters sat in the city court by virtue of his office of common clerk as a justice judge. He never held the office, but was simply paid for his services.
