Drowned in a Warehouse.—Willie Jones, the 4 year old son of Mr. George Jones, who keeps the West End House at the end of the South Wharf, was missing at supper time last night. He had been playing about Terrell's wharf in the afternoon, but after 5 o'clock was not to be seen. Becoming alarmed at not finding the child, Mr. Jones notified the police. A search was instituted and this afternoon Captain Hastings and Detective King found the body of the child in the wharf under the building adjoining the West End House.
