Lobster and Oyster Catch Ahead of Same Month Last Year - Total Catch of all Kinds Good.

that it was an exceptionally good one as regards the total catch of fish of all kinds in Canada. An interesting item, too, is that in spite of all the agitation of late in regard to the alleged depletion of the lobster and oyser fisheries of the dominion, the catch of both was considerably greater than during the same month last year. The total catch in November last was valued at \$1,161,144, as compared with \$373,900 during the same month last year. As regards oysters the bulletin shows that since October 1st the oyster fishery has yielded 20,232 barrels, against 17,934 during the same period in 1912. The catch of lobsters to the end of the month was 3,436 hundred weight, against 2,190 hundred weight during the same period in the preceding year.
