Coroner's Jury Brings In Verdict at Guelph

FINDs ALEX DUTKI CAME TO HIS DEATH AT HANDS OF JAMES GIOVANZANO.

Guelph, April 10.—At 12.30 this morning Foreman A. Malcolm, of the Coroner's jury in the inquest which investigated the circumstances surrounding the murder of Alex Dutki, the Austrian, who was shot

to death on Alice Street on Sunday evening, March 30, handed to Dr. Orton at the police station, the following verdict: "We find that Alex Dutki came to his death on March 30, 1919, from gunshot wounds received about the hour of 8.45 p.m. on Alice Street, Guelph, from a revolver in the hands of one James Giovannozzo."

For nearly four hours previous to the rendering of the verdict the jury listened to a chain of evidence which made it impossible for them to come to any conclusion other than that handed in. Two witnesses, John Nasodick, the Aus-

trian who is charged with being implicated in the murder, and John Zazera, who was with Dutki at the time he was shot, both swore positively that Giovannozzo had fired the fatal shots. A third witness, Mrs. Tom Mallott, told the jury that Giovannozzo had come to her house looking for the murdered man just previous to the shooting, and at that time had a revolver in his hand, and was putting cartridges in it. Evidence was also produced to show that the robbery of Mike Hoadyburn had been planned by Giovannozzo.

The preliminary hearing in the murder charge against John Nasodick and Jimmie Giovannozzo will probably be held next Tuesday morning. An effort was made to hear the case to-day, but Mr. L.W. Goetz, who is appearing for the Italian, was not ready to proceed. It was learned to-day that Giovannozzo had been in trouble before, having been convicted and fined for carrying concealed weapons at Welland last September. He paid \$25 and costs at that time.

At the Police Court this morning Tom Mallott and his wife, were further remanded to jail for a week. They are being held as material

witnesses in the Dutki murder case. It is altogether probable that Mallott will be charged with robbery and conspiracy, and perhaps another more serious charge will be laid against him.

American Troops Threaten Mutiny

ARCHANGEL INCIDENT MORE SERIOUS THAN AT FIRST REPORTED

Washington April 10.—The War Department issued to-night an official statement confirming Associated Press advices from Archangel that what amount to a mutiny occurred among the American troops there on March 30. A company of infantry the message stated refused to entrain for the front until personally urged to do so by Col. George W. Stewart, commanding the American contingent. Open threats were made of general mutiny unless a definite statement from Washington insuring early withdrawal was forthcoming.

The department has cabled for more information. From the message received to-day officials were unable to ascertain whether a condition of mutiny had in fact developed in the past
