FOR 1849 AND 1850.

The Ladies forming the Committee of Management of the Female Compassionate Society have only a brief but satisfactory report to present to the subscribers, on this the close of the 30th year of its formation, a period during which its utility has been sufficiently tested by the continued support of the public, to render any further observation on that subject superfluous. The collections for 1849, were completed so late in that year, that it was deemed unnecessary to renew it in 1850. as it was found that by a strict economy the sum in hand would be sufficient to meet the ordinary expences, till an early collection for 1851 should be made; no doubt being entertained of any failure in the accustomed support of the public.

It only remains for the Committee to express their gratitude to the Almighty Giver of all Good, for His gracious protection during the past years—only one of the number relieved since the last report having been removed, making in all only 11 since 1820. Relieved since 1848, 206; in all 3132.
