

## Study Youth Centre For Port Credit

**PORT CREDIT** — A recommended youth centre used as a focal point on a continuous basis by all teenagers and young adults has received very favorable attention by council.

In a report recently drawn up by Alex Burton, a member of the council, the common problem of all teenagers is brought into focus: where to go and what to do.

In the opinion of many, there is sufficient provision in organized sport including hockey, paddling, rowing, hardball, softball, lacrosse, track, gymnastics, swimming, soccer, volleyball and football.

But for those who do little participation in organized sport, particularly girls, there are only limited activities.

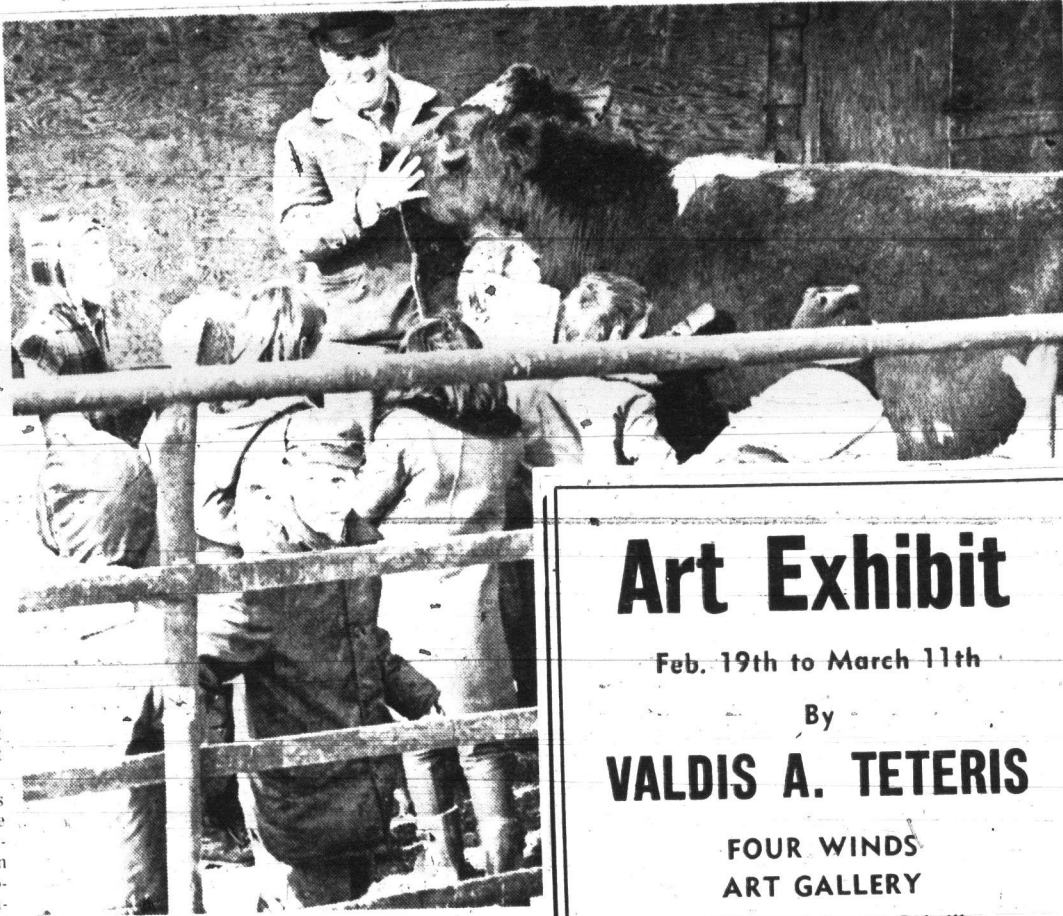
The report emphasized that the missing faculty is, therefore, a centre where anyone will be able to participate with an active role.

It was suggested that the centre would include a drama and lecture area, a dance, instruction and drill area and a workshop with a discussion and workshop area. The teenagers themselves could successfully operate the centre on a profitable basis with some adult guidance.

It was recommended that the council not become involved in an official manner except that taxpayers vote on the matter in the next election at which time cost would be made known.

However, if service clubs or a committee were formed to create this proposed centre within town limits, through public subscriptions, it was recommended that council would provide property at \$1 per year.

Or if the centre could be an existing building, council would consider removing all tax assessments along with a grant equal to 10 per cent. of the purchase price.
