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Ottawa, September 18, 1909.

Sir,-

I beg to inform you that application has been made for enfranchisement by Paul Ames on behalf of himself and his son, James Ames, and by Elijah Hunter on behalf of himself and son, Isaiah Hunter, members of the Stony Band, and as the clauses of the Indian Act dealing with enfranchisement, namely secs. 107-123, both inclusive, have been extended by a Royal Proclamation to all Bands of Indians whose reserves are situated south of the north boundary of township number 70 as surveyed or projected through the provinces of Alberta and Saskatchewan, you may now take the necessary action under the provisions of the Indian Act for enfranchisement of these applicants.
