The Department has been informed that Mr. Cole stopped measuring the logs in dispute between Mr. Walsh and the Indians, and has returned home. Such being the case I have to instruct you to endeavour to affect an amicable settlement of the measurement of the remainder of the logs on the basis of Mr. Cole's measurement as already given and as instructed in telegram to you of the 20th ultimo. If a settlement cannot be arrived at on this basis, then you should at once employ local cutters to complete the work.
