Ottawa, June 11th., 1946.

The Chief Inspector, Post Office Department, Ottawa.

On or about the 15th, of May we issued a cheque in favour of the Royal Bank of Canada, The Pas, Man., and intended to send it to that address. The cheque never reached its destination. There was, however, another address on our requisition indicating where the Bank should forward the funds, and this was Gillam, Man. I am inclined to think that the cheque must have gone to the Post Office at Gillam and is still lying there unclaimed. It should be in a Treasury Office window envelope with the Department of Finance stamp on it.

I would ask you to wire your Postmaster at Gillam, Man. inquiring if such a letter is there, and if so, to return it here. I enclose a franked telegram for that purpose. The cheque was for \$2,750.00 and due to the urgency with which the money is required, I am issuing another cheque today in favour of the Bank and I am very ammious to have the first cheque returned for cancellation.
