I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 15th. instant, in regard to question of appointment of Mr. Inspector Ditchburn to act as arbitrator in placing a valuation on Bare Island.

In reply I would say that it is considered, in view of the fact that your Department is also to appoint ; an arbitrator, and if the two arbitrators fail to agree, they are to appoint a third, that there would not appear to be sufficient ground to justify the Department in varying the course of procedure which has already been decided upon.
