mentioned licence in quadruplicate. If on examination you find this licence satisfactory and the Company accepts it will you please have the four copies signed and returned here for completion. The description refers to Plan B.C. 210, your copy of which was recently returned to you.

Although the Company has asked for a renewal for a period from five to ten years, the draft renewal enclosed is for one year, renewable for an additional year, which guarantees the Company two years operation. This is intended by the Department as a compromise and if the Company's operation is satisfactory they may, before the end of the second year, apply for renewal for an extended term, but for any renewal beyond the two years presently provided for the Company might expect to have to pay increased rates at values current in 1949.

The enclosed renewal is subject to your review and if you consider any changes necessary you should so advise before having the contract signed.

Inasmuch as the Company are paying ground rent they may be permitted to operate the portable sawmill at any point within the area included in their timber licence.
