Montreal Steel Common gained 13 points, from 105 to 118, and Laurentide Common 5 1-2 points from 139 1-2 to 145. There was no change in the Richelieu dividend, and the declaration for the quarter, at the old rate of 5 per cent, caused the stock to drop back in price. Dominion Steel Corporation was the most active stock and on sales of 112,937 shares advanced to 63 7-8. Montreal Power at 133 1-8 and Montreal Street at 241 were other high levels of the week.
